# Frequently Asked Questions and Answers

# Who can apply?

The South Dakota Solid Waste Management Association provides scholarships annually. Shortages of skilled labor in our industry have caused us to redirect our scholarship focus to meet solid waste industry needs. Preference will be given to children and spouses of SDSWMA members, South Dakota residents studying at South Dakota post-secondary trade schools, high school seniors and students currently enrolled full or part time in a South Dakota post-secondary trade school. Students who have received an SDSWMA scholarship in the past are eligible to apply each year. Children and spouses of Scholarship Committee members are not eligible.

# <u>How many scholarships are awarded annually and what are the dollar amounts of these scholarships?</u>

The SDSWMA normally awards 2 - 4 scholarships annually; however, more may be awarded depending on the number of applications received and available funds. The scholarships will range from \$750 to \$4,000.

#### How do I apply?

An applicant must submit a letter of application addressing the information requested on the scholarship application notice.

#### When is the application deadline?

Vocational trade degrees for Heavy Equipment Operations, Diesel Technology, Millwrights, Environmental Technicians, Welding, GPS/Computer Technicians, etc.
